





Content of Tool Box Talk

What is HIV: It is the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) that infects the immune system of the

What is AIDS: It is Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome. It is the most advanced stage of HIV infection.

It describes several of the characteristics of the disease:--

Acquired (A): It indicates that it is not an inherited condition.

Immune Deficiency (ID): It indicates that the body's immune system breaks down.

Syndrome (S): It indicates that the disease results in a variety of health problems.

It takes on average 5-10 years for the initial HIV infection to progress to AIDS if not treated.

How does HIV Spread?

HIV spreads when infected blood, semen or vaginal fluids enter the body. Because symptoms can be mild at first, people with HIV might not know they're infected. They can spread HIV to others without knowing

The main ways someone can get HIV are:

- 1. Sex without a condom
- 2. Having unprotected sex (meaning sex without a condom) with someone who has HIV, particularly unprotected vaginal sex and anal sex.
- 3. Passed from mother-to-baby during pregnancy, childbirth and breastfeeding:
- 4. A mother infected with HIV can pass the virus to her baby via her blood during pregnancy and birth, and through her breast milk when breast feeding.
- 5. Sharing injecting equipment
- 6. Sharing needles, syringes or other equipment used to prepare and inject drugs with someone who has HIV
- 7. Contaminated blood transfusions and organ/tissue transplants
- 8. Receiving blood transfusions, blood products, or organ/tissue transplants that are contaminated

If someone feels that he /she has been exposed to HIV, the only way to find out if he/she has HIVis to have an HIV test.

How can't you get HIV?

There are many myths about HIV. Some people wrongly believe that HIV can be spread through the air (even though HIV can't survive in air). HIV can't be spread through saliva, casual contact, touching toilet seats or from mosquito bites.

How do someone protect himself / herself from HIV?

There are a number of ways you can protect yourself from HIV, including:

- using a condom every time you have any type of sex (vaginal, anal or oral sex)
- · avoiding sharing needles, syringes and other injecting equipment
- taking HIV treatment if you are a new or expectant mother living with HIV, as this will
 dramatically reduce the risk of passing HIV to your baby during pregnancy, childbirth and
 breastfeeding
- asking your healthcare professional if the blood product you are receiving (blood transfusion, organ or tissue transplant) has been tested for HIV
- If someone thinks he has been exposed to HIV, he should voluntarily take advice of a
 Doctorthrough the manager of the Contractor

It may be mentioned here that excessive stress at construction site and long absence from family may lead towards frustration for which they may resort to release their mental stress/pressure through uncontrolled sex. This should be avoided and contractor is also advised not to put any worker under excessive stress.

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INDUCTION TRAINING

(SONAMUKHI)

Project: Development of Sonamukhi Eco-Accommodation and Adventure Park and Rehabilitation of Unakoti Tourist Lodge at Kailashahar under TTDCL and TUTDP, Govt. of Tripura. Assisted by Asian Development Bank (ADB)

Agency: Tribeni Constructions Limited.

Crucial points/steps are covered in construction site induction training to ensure the safety of workers and for the compliance of the health and safety regulations.

Content of Induction Training

1. Site Overview

Detailed overview of the site, which includes:

- Site layout and boundaries: Use maps and diagrams to highlight key areas, ensuring everyone
 understands the site's geography.
- Operational zones: Distinguish between different areas such as construction zones, office areas, and restricted access areas. Explain safety measures and construction site access specific to each zone to prevent accidents and unauthorized access.
- Facilities: Identify locations of restrooms, break areas, first aid stations, and emergency exits.

2. Site-Specific Hazards

The site-specific hazards, including:

- Physical hazards: These may include machinery, vehicles, working at heights, and electrical risks.
 Detail the specific machinery used on site, safe operation procedures, and the importance of staying clear of moving vehicles and equipment.
- Chemical hazards: Discuss the proper handling of hazardous substances and procedures for spills.
 Add information on the types of chemicals present and the location of safety data sheets.
- Environmental hazards: Discuss how to prepare for and respond to severe weather, the presence
 of any dangerous wildlife, and other site-specific environmental concerns.

3. Health and Safety Policies

Clearly outline the site's health and safety policies, including the following essentials:

- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): Explanation and discussion on the specific types of PPE required for different tasks, where to get one, and the importance of proper usage to prevent injuries.
- Emergency procedures: Providing detail instructions on how to respond to different types of
 emergencies such as fire, medical emergencies, and evacuations.
- Incident reporting: Highlight of the impact of timely reporting of accidents, near misses, and hazards to improve site safety.

4. Work Procedures and Rules

Discussion regarding the specific work procedures and site rules, as the following:

Access control: It covering the check-in/check-out procedures, security measures in place, and any
identification badges or passes required.

- Permits to work: Detail the application process for obtaining permits, the criteria for approval, and
 the importance of adhering to permit conditions to ensure safety.
- Operational hours: Outline of the standard working hours, designated break times, and any
 restrictions on noisy activities to minimize disruptions and maintain a productive work environment.

5. Communication Protocols

Effective communication is key to site safety and efficiency. A few elements of discussion with the team:

- Radios and communication devices: To explain how to properly use radios and other communication devices, including designated channels for different types of communication and emergency broadcasts.
- Signage: Common signs and signals used on the site with example, their meanings, and the
 importance of adhering to these visual cues to avoid accidents and misunderstandings.
- Meetings and briefings: The expectation for attendance and participation in scheduled meetings and briefings to help them stay informed of the site conditions and changes.

6. Waste Management and Housekeeping

Outline procedures for maintaining a clean and safe work environment, including:

- Waste disposal: Specify the proper disposal of hazardous and non-hazardous waste, the locations
 of waste bins and recycling stations, and the importance of segregating waste to prevent
 contamination.
- Housekeeping: Highlighting the importance of clean workspaces, proper storage of tools and
 materials, and immediate clean-up of spills or debris to prevent accidents and ensure a safe working
 environment.

7. Training and Competency

To ensure that everyone on site has the necessary training and competencies of the essential training courses such as safety training, equipment operation, and first aid, and the importance of staying up-to-date.

8. Emergency Contacts and Resources

Emergency contacts and resources, including:

NOTIFICATION

In pursuance of the provisions of the Resettlement Plan (RP) prepared for the Asian Development Bank-supported Tripura Urban and Tourism Development Project (TUTDP) under Loan – 4375 IND in Tripura, it is required to establish a Grievance Redressal Mechanism (GRM) to receive, evaluate and facilitate the resolution of affected people's concerns, complains and grievances regarding social, environmental and other performance at project level.

The Urban Development Department (UDD), Government of Tripura is the Executing Agency for the project & Implementing Agencies for the project are the Tripura Urban Planning and Development Authority (TUDA), Urban Development Department (UDD), and Tripura Tourism Development Corporation Limited (TTDCL), Department of Tourism (DoT).

Now, as narrated in the Project Administrative Manual (PAM) issued by the ADB dated October, 2023 the Grievance Redressal Mechanism (GRM) and Grievance Redressal Committees (GRC) are hereby established at the three levels, viz, Site level, PIU level, and PMU level as mentioned below to address different stakeholder grievances and dissatisfactions about actual or pre-received impacts and to find a satisfactory solution. The GRM will be implemented throughout the project cycle for use by stakeholders to address concerns and complaints promptly and transparently.

1. Site Level GRC (1st level):

1.1. Composition of the GRC- The GRC at the Site level is constituted with the following members.

- 1,2. The Committee will be notified by the Project Manager (PIU).
- 1.3. Prior to registering the complaint/query, a procedural step will be in place to assess and check that issues raised in the complaint fall within the scope that the GRM is mandated to address.
- 1.4. Grievances thus accepted, acknowledged, and registered will be responded to the complainant in writing within 5 days' time and in the prescribed manner.
- 1.5. A Grievance Register will be maintained at the site level by this designated official to register the grievance as per the prescribed format attached in Annexure-I, including details of the date and type of grievance received the date of personal hearing provided to the complainant, the date when the grievance was redressed or if not redressed date of forwarding the grievance to the next level GRC.
- 1.6. Provision will be made to record and maintain grievances received directly on-site and incorporated in the Grievance Register. This will serve as the First Level of Grievance resolution.
- 1.7. Grievances that cannot be resolved at the site level within 5 days or in cases where the complainant is not satisfied with the decision, will be referred to the PIU-level (2nd level) GRC.
- 1.8. Grievances that do not reach a resolution at the PIU-level GRC (2nd level) within 10 days or in case where the complainant is not satisfied with the decision, will be further escalated to PMU level (3rd level) GRC.
- 1.9. With reference to complaints related to Gender Based Violence (GBV) / Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (SEA), the PIU will refer the case to the concerned Service Provider with an intimation to the Internal Committee (IC) under PMU and PIU and adhere to the principle of confidentiality while informing the same to the site level GRC (if required) as the case may be.
- 1.10.The designated official at the PIU will also be responsible for ensuring that a mechanism is put in place to address the grievances of laborers and staff deployed at project sites deployed at project sites by the Contractors.
- 1.11.The PIU will also ensure the installation of Display Boards at the site with GRM information with support from the implementation support NGOs and in consultation with the Project Management Unit (PMU), TUTDP.
- 1.12. The concerned Project Implementation Unit (PIU) will oversee the implementation of the Resettlement Plan (RP) and provide response to the grievances raised by the community and Affected Person(s) (AP).

- (ii) Grievances will be recorded as per the prescribed format attached at Annexure-1
- (iii) All grievances of the people at PIU level will be reviewed and resolved within 10 days from the date of submission.
- (iv) The complainant will have the right to be heard by the GRC before the committee gives its decision.
- (v) Intimation in writing should be sent to the aggrieved person about the date, time, and venue of the GRC sitting.
- (vi) With reference to complaints related to GVB/SEA, the principle of confidentiality will be adhered to.
- (vii) Decision of the PIU-Level GRC will be final unless an appeal is preferred with the PMU level.
